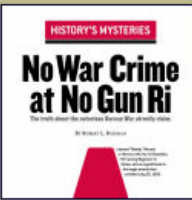
**Armchair General Game News**

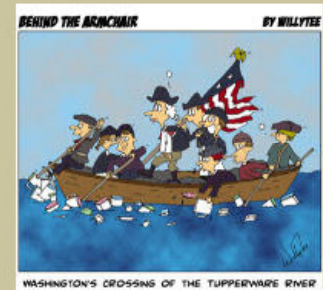
